Dr. Amber Goraya

Associate Professor Pediatric Radiology, MBBS, FCPS Diagnostic Radiology University of Child Health Sciences & The Children's Hospital Lahore, Pakistan

Dr. Amber Goraya is a Consultant Radiologist at University of Child Health Sciences & The Children's Hospital Lahore, Pakistan. She started as an FCPS trainee in 2005, then got designated as Senior Registrar Pediatric Radiology, Assistant Professor, and is currently serving as Associate Professor Pediatric Radiology. Over the years, she has developed interest in Neuro-imaging of Pediatric CNS tumors. She is working in close collaboration with AKU Neuro-Oncology team in diagnosing and management of children with brain tumors. Her special skills have enabled her to become Section In-Charge in MRI and CT Scan Departments. She is actively involved in teaching and training of FCPS students, Medical Imaging Technologists and paramedics. She is also serving as an examiner at University of Health Sciences Lahore, Pakistan and Supervisor as well as Examiner at College of Physicians and Surgeons, Pakistan. She has more than 20 publications to her credit in national and international journals.



Dr Samuel Sisay Hailu

Research Fellow Pediatric Radiology, Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, USA

Samuel Sisay Hailu is a research fellow at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. He trained in medicine at the University of Gondar, Ethiopia, completed radiology residency at Addis Ababa University, Ethiopia and pursued a pediatric radiology fellowship through the Addis Ababa University—CHOP collaboration. He has served in academic and leadership roles, including vice chair of the Radiology Department at Addis Ababa University, and has received multiple awards for teaching and mentorship. His research focuses on pediatric musculoskeletal MRI and global pediatric radiology. He has led national efforts to implement ultrasound-guided hydrostatic reduction of intussusception in Ethiopia, expanding access to non-surgical care across sub-Saharan Africa.

Dr Chetcuti completed medical training in Malta, certified as a Radiologist in the UK and completed a fellowship at the Royal Children's Hospital in Melbourne, Australia. She has worked in global radiology for 13 years, including as a Consultant Radiologist at the Queen Elizabeth Central Hospital in Malawi for 6 years. She was Radiology Lecturer and Postgraduate Lead for the new radiology residency programme at the Kamuzu University of Health Sciences in Malawi and now holds Honorary Lectureship. She is former Chair of the BSPR Outreach Group, held the role of senior specialist consultant for MSF and continues to work with Worldwide Radiology and the Malawi-Liverpool Wellcome Trust to develop radiology services in Malawi.She is passionate about capacity development, brainstorming innovative workflow solutions, networking and educational collaboratives as well as research in low and middle income countries.

After training in Interventional Radiology in the Netherlands, Liz decided to change tack and move to Ghana for three years to work as Head of Radiology at the Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital in Kumasi. Having made connections there with academics from the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine, she relocated to Liverpool as an NHS consultant, specialising in Tropical and Infectious Diseases. She continued to develop her interest in Medical Imaging in limited resource settings, resulting in co-founding the NGO Worldwide Radiology in 2017, as a pathway to facilitating long-term global health partnerships in Radiology. Developing Point of Care Ultrasound capacity for frontline clinicians is a special passion, as it reaches patients who may otherwise not have access to diagnostic tests at all.
